Three Verses

This year, part of my daily devotional time is dedicated to a program designed to get one through the Bible in a year. Each day features a brief commentary on the assigned passages, and then readings from either Psalms or Proverbs, the New Testament and the Old Testament. The program was set up several years ago and I've completed it a couple of times now, but never in a leap year. So I was really curious to see what would be included in this special day that interrupts the normal rhythm of the march of the months. I wasn't disappointed. The three passages spoke of our need to consistently and conscientiously spend time with the Bible each day because the words will speak to us in different ways at different stages (and sometimes even moods) we encounter on our life journey.

I found myself thinking of three verses (one from Psalms/Proverbs, one from the New Testament and one from the Old Testament) that are speaking to me at this moment in time. I came up with Psalm 40:1-2 (although I tend to use the rephrasing from the group U-2: "I waited patiently for the Lord. He inclined and heard my cry. He lifts me up out of the pit, out of the miry clay"). My New Testament verses remind of Jesus' promise to return for me once all the arrangements have been completed to meet His specifications. The Jeremiah passage speaks of the promise God made to me when I started seminary and the process of entering the ministry. It has also lifted me up and sustained me when I struggle, feel totally incompetent, or find myself doubting my calling. Below are these verses as found in the Common English Bible.

Psalms 40:1-2--"I put all my hope in the LORD. He leaned down to me; he listened to my cry for help. He lifted me out of the pit of death, out of the mud and filth, and set my feet on solid rock. He steadied my legs."

Current needs include 8– to 10-ounce lotion and 2-ounce diaper cream with zinc oxide.

The author of the winning manuscript will present his or her manuscript during the Laity Session of Annual Conference, which will take place at St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Indianapolis June 6-8.

Rules:



- Manuscripts must be original and based on the theme stated above.
- Manuscripts should be no more than 10 minutes in length when presented.
- Entries will be judged based on clarity, originality, relationship to the theme and composition.
- Manuscripts must be accompanied by a cover sheet that includes the writer's name, phone number, email address, local church name and district.
- Entrants are asked not to include any personally identifying information in the manuscript itself since the manuscripts will be judged anonymously.
- Previous winners are ineligible for 3 years.
- All entries MUST be received no later than Sunday, April 7.
- The winner will be notified on or before Friday, April 19.
