## Prayers for the General Conference

I've talked a little about "Breakthrough Prayer" over the past year, but it's truly time to put my thoughts, words, and ideas into use. The 2024 gathering of the General Conference which is the governing body of the United Methodist Church will begin on April 23, 2024 and end on May 3, 2024. So, what will be discussed at this meeting?

According to the official United Methodist News site (<u>https://</u><u>www.umnews.org/en/news/looking-ahead-to-general-conference-next-year</u>),

"The lawmaking assembly faces many proposals dealing with topics as varied as the denomination-wide <u>budget</u>, <u>social teachings</u>, <u>ecumenical relations</u> and <u>international structure</u>. "All told, General Conference has received <u>1,100 properly submitted petitions</u> — basically the United Methodist equivalent of bills before a legislature. And just like <u>a bill on Capitol Hill</u>, the first stop for a General Conference petition is in one of the gathering's legislative committees. In 2024, General Conference will have 14 legislative committees."

In other words, a bunch of stuff. Probably the topic that will be most watched (and reported on) will be any decisions regarding any changes or alterations to the denomination's policies regarding homosexuality. As you might expect, there will be a lot of different perspectives and attitudes shared and discussed! I encourage you to visit the website listed above to learn more about specific petitions that have been submitted.

The entire process is very similar to the workings of our government. In fact, the rise of Methodism in the United States paralleled the forming of our governmental processes. And although the alignment is slightly different (we


don't have one person who serves as President; the Council of Bishops is the closest we get to that). We do have a representative governing body that sets policy and a judiciary arm that enforces the policies.

## 2024 Sermon Manuscript Contest

The Indiana Conference Board of Laity is pleased to sponsor the 2024 Laity Sermon Manuscript Contest again this year. The contest is open to all laypersons in the Indiana Conference.

In collaboration with the 2024 Indiana Annual Conference Session, the theme for this year's manuscript contest is *Cultivate Joy!* based on Romans 15:13: "*May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.*" The author of the winning manuscript will present his or her manuscript during the Laity Session of Annual Conference, which will take place at St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Indianapolis June 6-8.

Rules:

- Manuscripts must be original and based on the theme stated above.
- Manuscripts should be no more than 10 minutes in length when presented.
- Entries will be judged based on clarity, originality, relationship to the theme and composition.
- Manuscripts must be accompanied by a cover sheet that includes the writer's name, phone number, email address, local church name and district.
- Entrants are asked not to include any personally identifying information in the manuscript itself since the manuscripts will be judged anonymously.
- Previous winners are ineligible for 3 years.
- All entries MUST be received no later than Sunday, April 7.
- The winner will be notified on or before Friday, April 19.
