Financial Report: Year 2024

Last year was a year of transition, going from a full-time minister to part-time at mid-year. Having to pay no health insurance, plus less salary and pension gave us a savings of over \$25,000. At that same time, we had people leave the church and others lower their giving. Full-year deficit for 2024 was about \$36,000 with \$16,000 coming in the second half of the year. Funds to make up the deficit came from the sale of the van four years earlier and the transfer of trust fund monies. The trust fund balance is now \$160,000.
